## New Construction Industry Blueprint for Suicide Prevention Released through National Partnership

Washington D.C., September 3, 2015 – The Bureau of Labor Statistics has identified the construction industry among the top nine occupations with the highest risk for suicide. Demanding physical work, coupled with the stresses of seasonal employment and often minimal access to mental health care, often create a workforce vulnerable to mental health challenges like depression, substance abuse, and suicidal thoughts. Today, a national partnership of construction industry leaders and suicide prevention experts launch a collaborative initiative designed to prevent suicides.

The Carson J Spencer Foundation, in partnership with RK, and the National Action Alliance for Suicide Prevention, today, jointly released a suicide prevention guide entitled, A Construction Industry Blueprint: Suicide Prevention in the Workplace. The guide is a clear call-to-action to construction executives around the world to make suicide prevention a health and safety priority. It also gives managers clear guidelines on healthy approaches and prevention measures. The Blueprint is offered as a free downloadable PDF resource from <a href="www.WorkingMinds.org">www.WorkingMinds.org</a> and is intended to assist the construction industry workplaces build their capacity to better prevent suicide.

"The tough-guy culture in construction certainly makes for rugged employees, but when people are overwhelmed by chronic pain, job uncertainty or mental health problems like depression or substance abuse, this tough exterior can prevent workers from reaching out and getting much needed support and treatment," said Sally Spencer-Thomas, CEO and Co-Founder of the Carson J Spencer Foundation, the lead partner on the Blueprint project.

The Blueprint was produced by the Carson J Spencer Foundation, a Denver-based nonprofit leading innovation in suicide prevention, and was sponsored by RK. Additional support was provided by the National Action Alliance for Suicide Prevention, ACIG, BCRC Administration, Inc., Cator, Ruma & Associates, Colorado State University, Denver Metro Chamber of Commerce, G.H. Phipps, Lakeside Industries, RK, Shaw Construction, Surescape Insurance Services, LLC., and the U.S. Department of Labor – OSHA, Region VIII.

"Helping construction companies be proactive and prevent suicide makes sense," said Jon Kinning, COO of RK.
